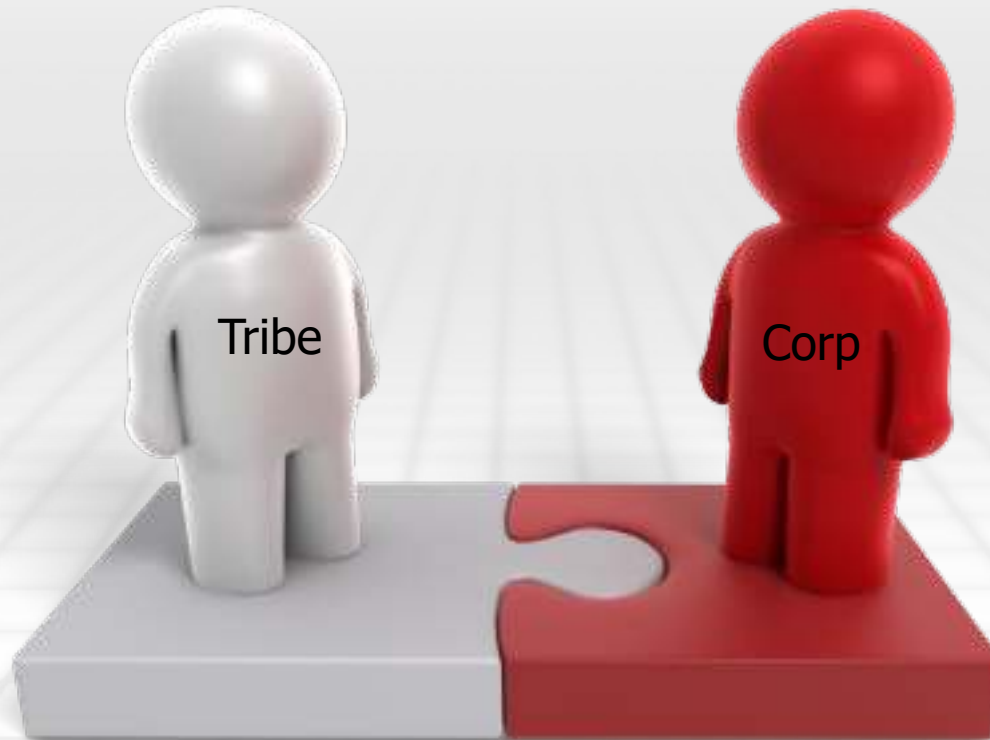

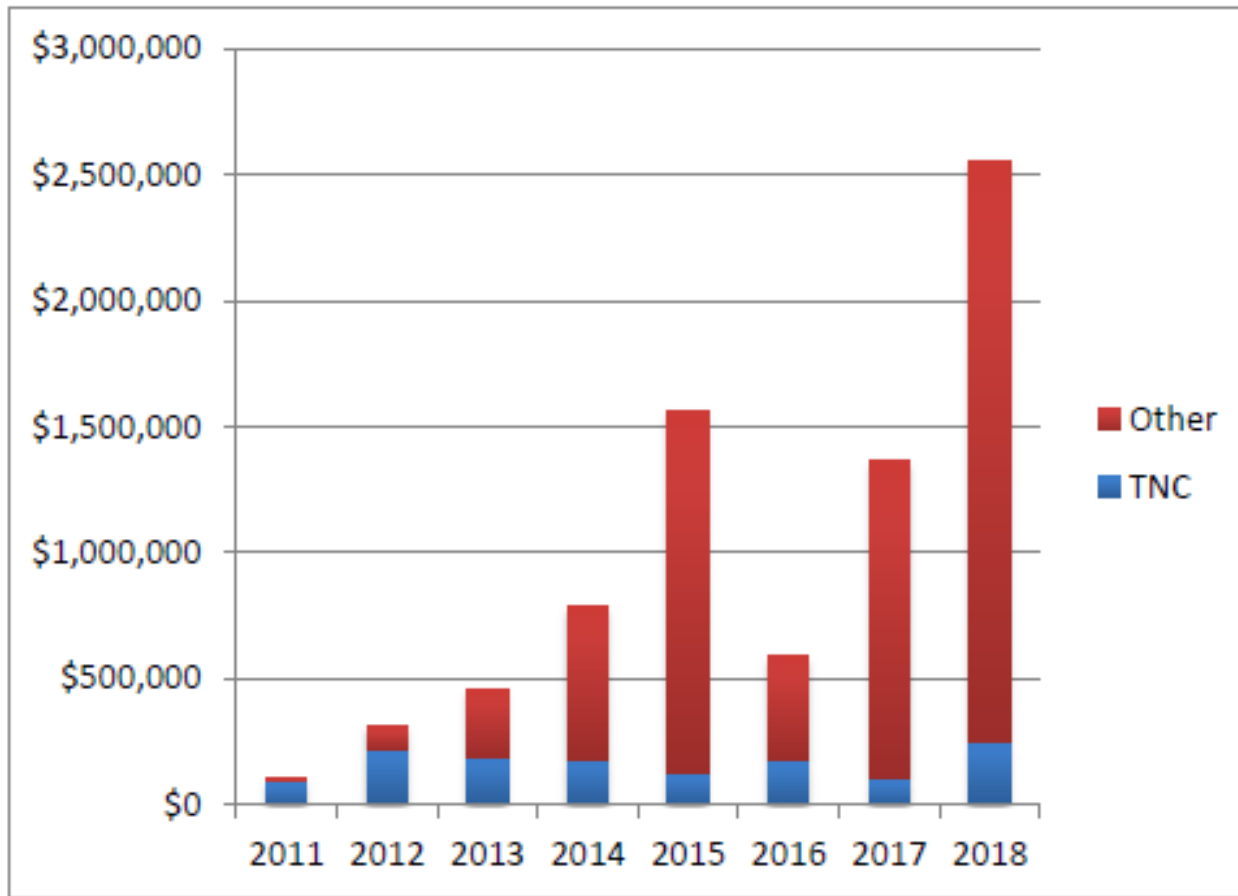

How TTCD Supports TNC

Description	Type	Amount
Tyonek Contractors LLC Contract: TTCD utilized grant funds to contract TCLLC for culvert construction work in 2018, resulting in local jobs and income for TNC.	Direct/Cash	\$508,770.00
CSP Contract: TTCD coordinated meetings and assisted with paperwork for TNC to enter into a Conservation Stewardship Program agreement with USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service. This is a five year contract, with an annual payment of \$41,120 until 2021.	Direct/Cash	\$41,120
EQIP Contract: TTCD worked with TNC to apply for funding and completed culvert replacements to secure funding. TNC keeps 10% of the contract as an admin fee.	Direct/Cash	\$50,982.83
TOTAL		\$600,872.83

In 2018, TTCD provided direct financial benefits of \$600,872.83 to TNC.

TNC donated \$250,000 to TTCD during the same time period.
